


The exhibition explored five exciting themes, each tailored to specific grade levels, encouraging students to envision a brighter future through their artwork:








#### 25th Anniversary
















#### GRADE 11'S MALAYSIAN ESCAPADES

Tournament. Unfortunately, their journey was impacted by an injury to Raahim Danial during the semifinal match, which was followed by a 2-1 loss.


- TLT's Under 13 team beat; Cedar School: 4-1 and Kareem Kerai Academy: 2-1.

#### WHAT WAS YOUR INITIAL REACTION AFTER


#### BEING CHOSEN?
